HEAD MASTER

CHANGES TO ATTENDANCE MONITORING

From September 2015, the national threshold for persistent absence rises to 90%, or the equivalent of 19 days' absence in any academic year. Government research demonstrates that student achievement increases significantly in line with high levels of attendance.

We understand that there will always be students for whom attendance is an issue because of ill health. Although overall attendance at King's is significantly above the national average, it is important that parents are aware of the change as the new threshold will lead to close monitoring of student attendance for those falling below the 90% limit.

NEPAL EARTHQUAKE APPEAL

Staff and students raised £504.40 for the Nepal Earthquake Appeal. The money has been sent to Community Action Nepal—a charity with which the school has close ties.

Following on from the note above, Mr Adams who some will remember as a former Teacher of Mathematics at King's, wrote "I couldn't help wonder how many trips the five mountain rescue stretchers and first aid equipment that King's School took out to Nepal in 2008 have made in the last few days. The school has just cause to be proud of the contributions it has made to helping the Nepalese people."
