HEAD MASTER

As another busy start to the first term of the 2017 calendar year draws to a close, may I draw your attention to several important matters:

<u>External Examinations</u> – Once again the external examination season is looming for GCSE and A level students. Examinations start in about ten weeks. Please encourage your son to maintain his revision programme over the half term break

<u>Mock Examinations</u> - Sixth Form mock examinations will take place from 20-28 February, 2017.

<u>National Fair Funding Consultation</u> — Funding pressures are being felt across all phases in all schools. Though government ministers state that sufficient funding is being put into the education system, in reality all schools are managing rising costs, consequently there has been a real term funding cut.

At King's the Governors and Senior Leaders are working hard to endure that financial pressures have as little impact on teaching as possible. That said, parents can help by responding to the Fair Funding Consultation by following this link: https://consult.education.gov.uk/funding-policy-unit/schools-national-funding-formula2/. The consultation closes on 22 March 2017. The key points to make in your response are:

- There needs to be an increase in the overall schools budget.
- The proposal to reduce the per pupil factor in the national budget from 76.5% to 72.5% should be overturned. This aspect of the proposals hits King's hard. It would be much better if the percentage could either remain at 76.5% or preferably be increased to 80%.
- Finally it would be helpful if parents who respond could make the point in the final question that it is essential that schools receive a <u>reasonable</u> minimum amount of funding per pupil - for secondary schools a sum of £4800 per student is considered viable.

Any support that you can give to this important consultation is greatly appreciated.

<u>CHEMISTRY</u>— On Saturday 21 January, Mr Downing (Subject Leader for Chemistry) took 4 boys to Derby University to represent the School and County in the Regional Finals of the annual 'Top of the Bench' competition organised by the Royal Society of Chemistry.

Ed Johnstone (Y11), George Cottle (Y10), Harvey Foster and Mihails Kosmans (Y9) were quizzed on their depth of general knowledge, such as 'which element has been recently used to kill an ex KGB agent?'

The second part of the day focused on the team producing a new lubricant which would be made for the next generation of car engines. Their task was to produce a lubricant from 4 existing lubricants and formulate one that would allow a ball-bearing to move through the sample in exactly 59 seconds. The twist was that they also has to calculate how much this lubricant would cost to formulate as well!

King's came a respectable 8th out of 400 schools from the East Midlands area. It was a pleasure taking the boys even on a dreary Saturday morning, they represented the school to an amazing standard and did themselves proud.

CAREERS TALKS


The school recognises the importance of providing independent careers advice to the boys. The aim of our careers talks is to 'open minds' to a wide range of careers using the expertise of our parents. We were delighted with the attendance at this terms event held on 2 February 2017.



Parent, Rob Dorsett is currently one of Sky Sports' senior reporters, covering stories mainly for Sky Sports News. He began his journalism career as a volunteer reporter for 'Redbrick', the University of Birmingham student newspaper, before winning the Young Sports Journalist of the Year title with the Independent newspaper in 1995. His first contract was with BBC Radio WM in Birmingham in 1996, where he worked as a news reporter, before moving to TV the following year, covering news and sport stories for BBC Midlands Today. He moved to London in 2000, to become Chief News reporter at BBC London before returning to Nottingham in 2002 to become Sports Presenter of BBC East Midlands Today. After almost 3 years fronting the show, he moved to Sky Sports to become Midlands Correspondent, where he's remained for the last 12 years. His 20 year career has seen him cover major sporting events and stories all over the world, including the 2004 Olympics in Athens for the BBC, and the European Football Championships in Poland and Ukraine in 2012. Last year, he interviewed David Beckham in London, and Usain Bolt in Jamaica.

Rachel Dorsett has 25 year's experience in PR, starting as a press office assistant at Central Television where she worked to promote ITV TV programmes in light entertainment and drama, working with Bob Monkhouse, Noel Edmonds and Jeremy Clarkson to name but few. She was headhunted to the BBC in London three year's later where she continued her career for ten years - working out of TV Centre in London and later the Pebble Mill studios in Birmingham. Taking charge of the Leisure and Lifestyle programming department which included all of Delia Smith's BBC TV series and other well known chefs. Crisis management became a large part of her role and the art of keeping celebrity presenters out of the News of the World was as big a part of the job as getting publicity within these titles.

In 2004, Rachel left the BBC to go freelance, specialising in PR for the food and drink sector. From pies, to cheese, from California prunes to restaurants - the past 12 years have been an international foodie PR journey, working in Poland, Russia, America and Italy. Rachel is now director at Cartwright Communications - a PR agency in Nottingham, where she heads up the consumer PR division and works on bringing in a range of new business for the agency as well as heading various high profile accounts from the national Bistrot Pierre restaurant chain to global health and well being brand Jeunesse.
