I hope that you are aware that you cannot appeal the Centre Assessed Grades and that the 'Triple Lock' announced by Gavin Williamson on the morning of the A level results appears to have been withdrawn. In essence you can now ask the school to check whether an administrative error was made when submitting the centre assessment grade or position in the rank order. If we have made an error then we will submit an appeal to the exam board. You can also appeal if you believe that something went wrong in processing your result.

If you believe that we have discriminated against you then you also have a right to appeal and in this instance you should bring a complaint against the school using our complaints procedure: http://www.kings.lincs.sch.uk/page/?title=Policies&pid=51

If you are not satisfied with the grade that you were awarded then you can take an examination in October to demonstrate the result you would have achieved:
