Dear Parents and Carers,

Following a particularly late Easter this has felt like a very short term. It has, however, remained packed with activities and the boys as always have been taking lots of wonderful opportunities.

By the time we go to print the Year 11 students will be in the thick of their GCSE examinations and the Year 13 students will equally be embroiled in their GCE Advanced Level examinations. We are all very proud of the progress that they have made and impressed by the amount of revision being completed.

Earlier this term, I was enormously privileged to meet with the Year 13 students, along with Matthew Spours, the President of The Old Boy's Society. He welcomed the boys into the Old Boy's Society and wished them the very best of luck for their bright futures. It was a special moment, and a pleasure to see such fine young King's Men.

It was also a term when we officially opened the new Student Support Centre (SCC). We were joined by the Mayor of Grantham, Coun Lynda Coutts who, with the Chair of our Governing Body Mr Paul Ross, proudly opened this fantastic addition to the school. The boys and their parents were clearly very proud of the new facility and we all look forward to the continued work ahead to improve this part of the school. Unfortunately, we have not yet been able to raise the money to complete the outside space which we would like to convert into a garden area for students in the future.

The school may be closed to students over the half term period, however, work will continue on site improvements. I am delighted that the first stage of our new IT network will take place over the week with the introduction of fibre optic cables. This will be followed next term by a new network backbone allowing faster access speeds. I am hopeful that by the end of the summer vacation we should be in a much stronger position and that we will be able to start to introduce faster PCs to reduce logging on times and offer a significantly better student experience.

Could I take this opportunity to remind parents and students that the school should be a nut free site, as we have a number of students with allergies to nuts.

## ATHLETICS

Jonathan Esiwe of Year 10 was the sole competitor representing Lincolnshire as the U15 all-round winner of the Regional Finals of the UK's Sportshall Finals. The final was held at the Etihad Campus in the hall next to the Manchester Athletic Track.

Jonathan's first event was the two lap race which is his favourite event. He finished first in his trial, and after a countback of the 34 runners, he came in third place and was presented with a bronze medal, being only 0.02 seconds behind the winner. In his next event, the standing long jump, he leapt 2.54m, putting him in 10th place. Jonathan's last event was the shot put in which he achieved 10.17m, giving him 15th place. Overall he came a very commendable 10th place out of 65 U15 boys, with 247 points. The winning score was 284 points. Well done Jonathan.

On 27 April both King's and Magnus attended training in the woods and field area at Stoke Rochford. Section Battle Drills and Sentry duties were part of the training programme delivered during a wet and windy day.
