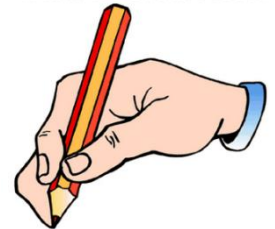
- Ensure your son takes pride in his purple English exercise book, which is where all classwork and homework is completed. All worksheets should be glued in.
- **Vocabulary** is a big priority – please encourage your son to read on a regular basis as part of the **Accelerated Reader Programme**. Borrowing books from both the school library and local public libraries is helpful. Encourage your son to keep his **reading log** up to date.
- **Reading and learning homework** needs to be approached with the same seriousness as written homework. The Department runs knowledge recall tests on texts, as it is useful preparation for studying English Literature at GCSE. Learning spellings helps to make success in the annual year 7 Spelling Bee more likely, too!

- Although GCSE seems a long way off, the years soon pass and **legibility and presentation** is important in written exams. We therefore implement a Department policy that all homework – unless the teacher specifies otherwise – should be handwritten.
- **Extra English** is available for anyone requiring additional support – information is available from the class teacher. Handwriting support is also offered.
- If your son is **unable to attend a lesson**, it is important to catch up with anything that he may have missed.
- Please ensure your son keeps any books issued to him in good condition.
- Families can also help by **listening to speeches/talks** which your son is asked to prepare before delivering. Speaking & Listening does form part of the GCSE English Language qualification.
