CAREERS TALKS

As part of our ongoing Careers Education programme for students and parents, the following talks have taken place:

Iain Standen—CEO of Bletchley Park Trust

Iain gave a talk on the running of Bletchley House, which housed the government Code and Cypher School (the forerunner to GCHQ) during the second world war.

Iain assumed this role in January 2012, following 28 years as a commissioned officer in the British Army.

Iain spoke briefly about his career in the Army and how the skills he learned and developed there helped him to move from a military to a civilian career and how he continues to use them in the heritage environment. He also spoke about careers in history and heritage and the exciting and varied opportunities this sector offers to intelligent and enthusiastic young people.

Nick Birch—HR Manager at Experian

Nick spoke about career options in a multinational technology company.

Fina Martinez—Magistrate

Fina is a magistrate on the adult and youth bench and administers appeals in the Crown Court. She spoke of roles in a magistrate court and how people can be involved/employed in the court system.

Mike McLoughlin—Barrister

Mike works for Microsoft as the Group Investigations Manager for Europe, the Middle East, Africa and India region. He leads a team that investigates such matters as fraud, corruption and false accounting. The theme of Mike's presentation was 'apparently boring jobs are not necessarily boring' and 'you don't have to practice law just because you studied law'.

James Hollands—Careers in Geology and the Oil Industry

James works as a consultant Geologist in the oil and gas exploration industry and has spent the last 35 years travelling the world drilling wells and finding oil. James spoke about career opportunities in the oil industry, not just for Geologists, but also for Engineers of many disciplines.

Justin Cowling—Talk on International Business

Justin began his career by studying an Electronic Engineering degree. He then worked in sales, marketing and Software Engineering Business Development. Justin also shared his experience of living and working in California where he spent 16 years in high-tech industries in Silicon Valley.

DRUG & ADDICTION TALK

This term students from Years 9 and 10 received a talk on drugs and addiction from Simon Leigh. Simon qualified with a Masters Degree in Addiction Counselling and runs private practices in London. His expertise has led to regular work with the BBC and he is also a regular contributor to broadsheet newspapers and medical journals. There was also an evening talk to enable parents to keep abreast of what their son is learning and to offer guidance and advice on how to talk to teenagers about drugs.

School Council E-Safety Assemblies





On Sunday 9 November, our Year 8 Rugby squad acted as the guard of honour for Leicester Tigers at Welford Road in front of 16,000 people. The boys proved to be a lucky omen for the Tigers as they ran out 27-10 winners against the Sale Sharks. More of these trips will be planned next year for other squads. The boys were a credit to the school.



Rugby Report

The school has played 57 rugby matches across all age groups during terms 1 and 2 which is a big achievement for a state school with limited resources, compared with many of the independent schools we play against.

Year 7: This has been an excellent year for this young talented side, with only one defeat all season (to Northampton School for Boys). The team has recorded impressive wins over Stamford School, Witham Hall, Wisbech Grammar and Carre's in term 2. In all, 27 boys have played in the school team and the strength in depth throughout the squad is impressive.



Year 8: The Year 8s have had a very good end to the season, finishing strongly with 3 wins in a row against Wisbech Grammar, Leicester Grammar and Witham Hall. The team was superbly managed this year by Mr Whales and Mr Richardson with all boys getting equal playing time.

Year 9: The Year 9 team have improved as the season has gone on and had a better season than last year with 5 wins and 5 losses. They ended the season with an impressive 47-

15 victory over Leicester Grammar. Mr Harrison has made big improvements with his coaching and commitment to after-school training and matches on Saturdays.

Year 10: Mr Collins has worked hard with our Year 10 squad, who made it to the last 64 of the National Vase and would have gone a lot further had we not drawn a very good Oakham side in the fourth round. The boys recorded impressive wins against Leicester, Wisbech and Spalding Grammar schools to finish with 6 wins from 12 matches.

2nd XV: A very young 2nd XV improved immensely as the season progressed with very good wins over Priory LSST, Carre's and Leicester Grammar. It is worth noting that our 2nd XV played both Carre's and Priory LSST's 1st XV squads, which shows the strength we have in our senior rugby teams.

1st XV: The 2nd XV had a better season than last year, along with a much tougher fixture schedule. After a heartbreaking defeat to Greshams in the National Cup, the boys bounced back to record impressive wins against Northampton School for Boys and Leicester Grammar, to finish the season strongly. This is a very young 1st XV and next season promises to be one to remember.

The 1st XV had 9 boys in the U18 Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, Derbyshire (NLD) squad this year which won the U18 Midlands Division for the first time in 5 years. SCIENCE

GCSE Science Live Event

Year 11 scientists travelled to London to hear lectures from 5 of Britain's top scientists—Professor Robert Winston, Professor Andrea Sella, Professor Steve Jones, Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock and Dr Simon Singh. The day was fast-moving, exciting, thought-provoking and gave students the chance to raise issues with the scientists.



SKYLON Talk at RAF Cranwell

A group of 44 Sixth Form Physicists attended a talk by Philippa Davies, Performance Engineer at Reaction Engines Ltd, entitled 'Jet into Space'. Reaction Engines are designing and manufacturing a new jet engine to power a plane up to the edge of the atmosphere using oxygen from the air and liquid hydrogen. This Lecture was sponsored by the local Civil Engineering group.

During the Gravity Fields Festival the A level Physicists visited St Wulfram's to see a CERN live event. There were demonstrations of a bubble chamber, superconducting magnets and a model of the Large Hadron Collider amongst others as well as physicists from CERN who were available to talk to students.

PROJECT X—What Is It?

What is Project X? It is all about engineering and design innovation and the challenge was open to Year 8 students. They were required to deliver 'vital survival equipment' to two aircrew that have ejected from their aircraft and landed in enemy territory. For this challenge, the team had to plan, design and build an aircraft with a release system to allow the vital survival equipment to be delivered, without breaking, to each of the downed pilots—remembering not to injure the pilots when delivering the supplies! (The vital supplies were radios represented by eggs).

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SCIENCE (continued)

This year we started off Project X with a House competition culminating in a dragons den competition prior to half-term. This was won convincingly by Curteis House. Having spent a large number of frantic lunchtimes and after-school sessions, the plane was built. We finally arrived at RAF Waddington on 19 November for a Day of Trials competition—essentially visits to different branches of the Royal Air Force trades. The Team had an excellent design based on a Hercules C130 transport plane



complete with a delivery system from the rear of the plane. Having tried valiantly to drop their eggs on target and succeeding in the delivery of 2 out of 4, it wasn't good enough to take first place, despite giving the best Dragons Den pitch for their Year group.

15 Year 10 boys attended a morning of STEM activities at RAF Cranwell on 5 December with Mr Collins (Head of Year 10). The boys took part in a series of group activities led by Sqn Ldr Tamzin Keenlyside.
