4.30pm – 5.00pm	Adrian Mallinson Investment Banking	Adrian spent twenty years in the City where he undertook a number of trading and asset management roles primarily in the securitisation and credit derivatives sectors. He was most recently a Partner at Cheyne Capital Management (UK) LLP. Adrian holds an MSc in Mathematics from the University of Nottingham. The purpose of the talk is to give students, who may be interested in pursuing a career in the City, an insight into the breadth of roles within the banking sector. The discussion will focus on the 'front office' roles typically offered by Investment Banks (Sales & Trading, Corporate Finance, Equity Research and Capital Markets).	
5.00pm – 5.30pm	Professor Carys Siemieniuch Loughborough University	Professor of Enterprise Systems Engineering in the School of Electronic, Electrical and Systems Engineering at Loughborough University. Within the School Carys is the Programme Director for the undergraduate courses [BEng and MEng) in Systems Engineering. Systems Engineering, to paraphrase the course brochure is a structured comprehensive engineering approach to solving today's complex technical challenges, particularly those related to the design and development of complex, sophisticated systems such as aircraft, ships, automobiles, telecommunication networks, energy infrastructures, information systems etc. It is widely agreed that the UK needs to train around 87000 engineering graduates a year - double the previous rate - by 2020 to not only replace those engineers who will have retired but also to meet the ever increasing demand from all areas of industry and commerce. The purpose of the presentation is to talk about the benefits of engineering as a career, various routes students can take and also to describe a range of engineering disciplines together with the sorts of domains where these skills are needed from fashion to pharmaceuticals, from medicine to renewable energy, from formula one to military jets, from finance to infrastructure design and operation.
