The King's School, Grantham A Historical View from the Quad

In the background on the right is the original house for the Master, completed in 1528. Behind that is the original school, now housing the School Library, also completed in 1528. The central red brick building is the Dining Room built in 1855 with the 1893 Dormitory above. To the left are the Boarders' Studies.





In 1904, part of a mid-nineteenth century block, seen on the right, was removed to allow the central building to house the boarders to be completed. The school entrance had been moved from Church Street to here in the midnineteenth century and in 1904 was moved to Brook Street. The classrooms on the left were built in 1957.

The classrooms and laboratories on the right were built in 1904 and enabled the school to teach science subjects. On the left are laboratories and workshops of 1957. Between the two is the school entrance until 1969. To the left are later buildings.





The Tower Block and the Gymnasium were erected in 1969 on what had been the vicarage garden. Beyond them is the Sixth Form Centre and, built in 2008, the Newton Block.

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
