



HEAD MASTER

STUDENT SAFETY

I ask parents for their support to address a number of safety concerns.

Road awareness

I have received several reports that younger boys are not road aware. They are putting themselves at risk by darting in between traffic. Please talk to your son to make sure that he crosses roads using pedestrian crossings.

Cars on the school site at the start and end of the day

Sadly, a small minority of parents persist in driving onto the school site at the start and end of the school day. It is barely believable that these parents then turn their cars and exit the school site whilst large numbers of boys are exiting the site.

Please drop your son outside the school boundary and collect him at an agreed point at the end of the day.

THIS MUST BE DONE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL STUDENTS.

SMART WATCHES ETC

Parents and boys in examination year groups must note the following instruction from examination boards.

Potential technological/web-enabled sources of information such as:

- ◆ iPods/iWatches/Mobile phones/MP3-4 players and wrist watches that have a data storage device

Are not permitted. Any student found in the examination room with any such device will be automatically disqualified.

Invigilators will make an announcement to students. It is the responsibility of each student to ensure compliance.

From the beginning of Term 4 iWatches or similar watches that are web-enabled will not be allowed in school. These watches will be treated in the same way as mobile phones.

SHISHA PENS

I remind parents and boys that Shisha pens are not permitted in school and will be dealt with as part of our policy on Drugs, Tobacco and Alcohol.

Finally, I have been asked by the Eden Hotel that parents do not use their car park when dropping off or picking up their sons.

Tennis

Having won the Lincolnshire championships and following victories in the first two knock-out rounds against Nottingham High School and High Storrs School. King's senior tennis team travelled to the prestigious Rugby School in the National Tennis competition. The side were always going to be up against it facing a school who consistently reach the national finals, last year finishing 3rd in the country. King's were also giving away (indoor) home advantage and having to play on Rugby's outdoor courts in very cold and windy conditions.

The team equipped themselves superbly, quickly getting into their opponents during the singles matches. Joe Patton and Oliver White secured excellent victories in their matches beating Rugby's number 2 and 4 seeds 6-4 and 6-2 respectively. Lewis Picker was made to work a bit harder by their number 2 seed who took the match to a tie-break. Thankfully Lewis edged this to take his match 7-6. Michael Cragg faced a very strong number 1 seed who was just too strong for Cragg and White so the match came down to the two Year 11s, Patton and Picker, who were facing two Year 13s! The pair once again managed to outwit their opponents in fine fashion and record an impressive 6-4 victory and with that secure a place in the next round for King's. The side now face Magdalen School in the round of 16. If they are successful they will qualify for the National Finals for the first time in the school's history, as one of the top 8 schools in the country. To visit one of the top independent schools in the country created a memorable day for all involved and to beat them was an incredible achievement.

The next fundraiser will be the popular chocolate tombola with an Easter twist. The boys do love these and the demand is always high.


